For most students, AP World History: Modern will be their first exposure to an AP-level course. As a result, the transition from a Regents course to an AP course can present challenges to even the strongest students. The intention of this prep course is to support students through this transition by clarifying course expectations and teaching many of the basic skills that they will need to be successful in AP World History: Modern. Students will be provided with an overview of the course, learn the basics of writing and debate, learn critical test preparation skills, and more. The purpose of this prep class is to prepare students ahead of the course and prevent the later need to respond to struggles with more retroactive approaches, such as tutoring.





In AP World History: Modern, students investigate significant events, individuals, developments, and processes from 1200 to the present. Students develop and use the same skills, practices, and methods employed by historians: analyzing primary and secondary sources; developing historical arguments; making historical connections; and utilizing reasoning about comparison, causation, and continuity and change over time. The course provides six themes that students explore throughout the course in order to make connections among historical developments in different times and places: humans and the environment, cultural developments and interactions, governance, economic systems, social interactions and organization, and technology and innovation.
